*University in the Kingdom of Yugoslavia 1918 – 1941 (Through laws and other regulations)*

*Summary*

The study of history of state and other institutions certainly represents one of the fundamental affairs of each Archives as part of the performance of its numerous archival tasks and particularly the ones linked to collection, arrangement and processing of archival records. This paper is intended to create the necessary and appropriate preconditions for the evaluation, keeping and use of archival records in each Archives including the Yugoslav. The regulations that the state enacts on its institutions form the basis for a review of their establishment, organization and work.

Universities in each state are certainly among the most important institutions securing its development and without their existence it is impossible to think of its survival and future.

This paper seeks to collect, systematize and process in one place all the regulations pertaining to the establishment, organization and work of the universities in the Kingdom of Yugoslavia adopted during the existence of that state (1918 to 1941). It first deals with all the general regulations on universities and then the regulations relating to particular issues from this field such as Faculty diplomas, disciplinary responsibility of students, association at the university and students' living standard.
